

TOWN OF CENTRAL BUTTE BYLAW NO. 2025-10

BYLAW TO ESTABLISH PENALTIES FOR THE CONTRAVENTION OF BYLAWS

The Council of the Town of Central Butte, in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

1. CITATION

This Bylaw may be cited as the “General Penalties Bylaw”.

2. GOVERNING LEGISLATION

The Municipalities Act (The Act) shall prevail in all circumstances where there might arise a conflict between The Act and the General Penalties Bylaw.

3. PURPOSE

- a) Any police officer, peace officer, employee of the Town, agent of the Town, or any person duly authorized by Council specifically is hereby designated authority to enforce all bylaws of the Town of Central Butte (the Town).
- b) Any person who contravenes any bylaw of the Town shall be served a Notice of Violation in a form approved by the Administrator of the Town or may be served a ticket or a summons in a form approved by the Administrator of the Town of Central Butte.
- c) Subject to the provisions of Section 3(a) and 3(b), no person shall:
 - i. contravene or fail to comply with a provision of any bylaw of the Town;
 - ii. obstruct or interfere with a police officer, a peace officer, an employee of the Town, an agent of the Town, or any person duly authorized by Council engaged in exercising on behalf of the Town any of the powers conferred by a bylaw of the Town;
 - iii. destroy, pull down, alter, or interfere with any work carried out or thing done by or for the Town pursuant to any bylaw of the Town.
- d) Every person who contravenes a bylaw of the Town is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction with respect to the contravention of that bylaw to the penalty specified in the bylaw.
- e) Every person who contravenes a bylaw of the Town where a bylaw does not specify a penalty is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction with respect to the contravention of that bylaw, as follows:

i. a fine of \$500.00;

iii. in the case of a continuing offence, a daily fine of \$500.00 for each day or part of a day during which the offence continues.

4. SERVICE OF NOTICE OR TICKET

a) Where any person has committed, or is alleged to have committed, a breach or contravention of any of the provisions of any bylaw of the Town a notice of violation, ticket, or summons may be served on such person by a police officer, a peace officer, an employee of the Town, an agent of the Town, or any person duly authorized by Council. Service of such notice of violation, ticket, or summons may be made by:

i. by attaching the notice of violation, ticket, or summons to the vehicle, structure, or place in respect of which a breach or contravention has been committed,

ii. by mailing such notice of violation, ticket, or summons addressed to the registered owner of said vehicle, structure, or place; or

iii. by any other means of service required or allowed by law.

5. PAYMENT

a) Such person served with a Notice of Violation, ticket, or summons shall pay same to the Town of Central Butte within a period of fourteen (14) calendar days from the service of the said Notice of Violation, ticket, or summons. If payment is made within such time and accepted, then that person shall not be liable to prosecution for the offense.

b) Where payment of any violation left outstanding beyond a fourteen (14) calendar day period from the time of issuance of the Notice of Violation, the Town may proceed in serving the accused with a Summons in a form approved by the Administrator of the Town of Central Butte.

c) Any Penalty Sum (fine and victim's surcharge) imposed as a result of a violation that is prosecuted and subsequently convicted by a court of competent jurisdiction shall be paid within fourteen (14) calendar days of the conviction, unless such other deadline is imposed by a judge of the court.

6. SEVERABILITY

a) If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or other portion of this bylaw is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, that portion shall be deemed

a separate, distinct and independent provision and the holding of the court shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of the bylaw.

7. REPEAL

- a) Bylaw 60/12 is hereby repealed.
